LETTER DATED 7 SEPTEMBER 1949 FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE INTER-AMERICAN COMMISSION FOR PEACE TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING THE OUTCOME OF A SITUATION WHICH HAD ARISEN BETWEEN CUEA AND FERU

Washington, 7 September 1949

In conformity with Article 54 of the United Nations Charter, I have the honour to inform the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, of a situation which was submitted to the Inter-American Commission for Peace (formerly known as the Inter-American Commission on Methods for the Peaceful Solution of Conflicts), by the Government of Cuba on 3 August 1949.

On the date indicated, the Government of Cuba requested the good offices of the Commission in endeavouring to find a solution for the situation which had arisen between the said Government and that of Peru as a result of the granting of asylum by the Cuban Embassy at Lima, on 29 December 1948, to the Peruvian citizens Dr. Fernando León Vivero and Engineer Pedro Muñiz. It was not, however, necessary for the Commission to take any action on the matter, as, on 17 August 1949, the Cuban Government informed the Commission that the above-mentioned persons had left the Cuban Embassy on 14 August.

I wish to thank the Secretary-General on behalf of the Inter-American Commission for Peace for his kind co-operation.
