Letter dated 26 September 1988 from the Permanent Representative of  
Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 7 September 1988 (A/43/598-S/20280 and Corr.1), I have the honour to report to you the following incident in violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side, which occurred on 23 September 1988:

On 23 September 1988, six Afghan aircraft penetrated into Pakistan airspace by 27 nautical miles in Nawagai, Dir District, at 1153 hours and dropped eight bombs in village Amluk Darra and Machu Kalley. As a result, one man and four children were killed and five injured. All of them were Pakistan nationals.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was called to the Foreign Office at Islamabad on the morning of 24 September 1988, and a strong protest was lodged with him over the unprovoked attack. He was asked to inform the authorities in Kabul that if such attacks did not cease the entire responsibility for the serious consequences would rest on them.

I request you to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda items 30, 72, 129, 133 and 136, and of the Security Council.
