PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1988-1989

Revised estimates resulting from resolutions and decisions of the Economic and Social Council at '- 4 first and second regular sessions, 1988

Report of the Secretary-General

- 1. At its first and second regular sessions, 1988, held in New York and Geneva respectively, the Economic and Social Council adopted resolutions and took decisions, the implementation of which would involve additional expenditure by the United Nations in 1988, 1989, 1990 and, in the case of decision 1988/116 of 25 May 1988, in 1992. In accordance with paragraph 3 of rule 31 of the rules of procedure of the Council, the Secretary-General submitted separate cost estimates in respect of each of the proposals prior to their adoption. In cases where the proposals originated in one of the subsidiary bodies of the Council, similar action was taken at the time the initial proposals were made.
- 2. The Council was informed that the programme budget implications of all the resolutions and decisions would be reviewed in their totality and that, to the extent required, revised estimates for the biennium 1988-1989 would be submitted to the General Assembly at its forty-third session. Requirements for 1990 and later years would be included in the Secretary-General's proposed programme budget for the relevant biennium.
- 3. The total estimated costs in respect of requirements arising out of resolutions and decisions adopted by the Council during its regular sessions in 1988 are summarized, for information purposes, in the annex to the present report.

The treatment of these costs, which cover both conference-servicing and other requirements, is explained in paragraphs 4 and 5. Further details are provided only in those cases where additional resources are being requested.

- The estimates of conference-servicing requirements amount to \$5,471,100 for 4. the biennium 1988-1989, \$361,100 for 1990 and \$521,900 for 1992. In accordance with established practice these requirements were calculated on a full-cost basis for information purposes. It will be recalled that the current appropriation for conference-servicing under section 29 of the programme budget for the biennium 1988-1589 contains provision not only for meetings that were known at the time of budget proparation, but also for a number of meetings that were expected to result from decisions of policy-making organs during the course of the biennium, such as those included in the present document. Therefore, should the General Assembly approve the resolutions and decisions adopted by the Council in 1988, no additional resources would be requested under section 29 at the present time. In accordance with past practice, any actual additional costs that might be incurred in connection with the implementation of these resolutions and decisions would be reported to the General Assembly in the context of the final performance report on the programme budget for the current biennium under section 29.
- 5. The estimates of requirements for items other than conference-servicing amount to \$3,518,100 for the biennium 1988-1989, \$280,400 for 1990 and \$21,800 for 1992. No provision for the 1990 requirements was made in the preliminary estimate of resources presented in the proposed programme budget outline for the biennium 1990-1991. Therefore, in accordance with paragraph 7 of document A/43/524, it is proposed that the amount of \$280,400 should be considered as additional to that estimate.
- 6. So far as the current biennium is concerned, it is expected that \$562,000 of the amount required will be provided from extrabudgetary resources under section 20 for the implementation of resolutions 1988/9 and 1988/15, both of 25 May 1988. Another \$2,373,000 is expected to be absorbed within resources already appropriated by the General Assembly at its forty-second session under the following sections of the budget:

7. The remaining \$583,100, which was identified in the statements of programme budget implications referenced in the annex to the present document, has been revised downward (see para. 12) and an amount of \$550,800 is now requested on a non-recurrent basis under sections 1, 6B, 9 and 19 of the programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989. That amount relates to the following resolutions: 1988/25 of 26 May 1988 on the situation of Palestinian women, 1988/54 of 26 July 1988 on assistance to the Palestinian people, 1988/36 of 27 July 1988 on activities of transnational corporations in South Africa and Namibia and 1988/62 of 27 July 1988 on the resumed session of the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination (CPC). The additional requirements are detailed below.

Resolution 1988/25. Situation of Palestinian Women

Section 6B. <u>Centre for Social Development and Humanitarian</u> <u>Affairs</u> (\$53,000)

8. By paragraph 4 of its resolution 1988/25, the Council requested the Secretary-General, as a matter of urgency, to send a mission composed of experts on the status of women to investigate the situation of Palestinian women and children, in the light of recent tragic developments in the occupied Palestinian territories. No provision was made in the programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989 for this activity and, consequently, an additional appropriation of \$53,000 is requested to cover the following requirements:

Resolution 1988/54. Assistance to the Palestinian people

Section 19. <u>United Nations Centre for Human Settlements</u> (\$127,500)

- 9. By paragraph 3 of its resolution 1988/54, the Council requested the Secretary-General to charge the United Nations Centre for Human Settlements (Habitat) with supervising the development of the programme of economic and social assistance to the Palestinian people to which reference was made in General Assembly resolution 42/166 of 11 December 1987, and to provide it with the funds needed to engage 20 experts in order to prepare an adequate programme.
- 10. No provision was made for this activity in the programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989 and an additional appropriation of \$127,500 is requested to cover the following requirements:

Resolution 1988/56. Activities of transnational corporations in South Africa and Namibia

Section 9. <u>United Nations Centre on Transnational</u> <u>Corporations</u> (\$271,600)

11. By paragraph 9 of its resolution 1988/56, the Council requested the Secretary-General to take all necessary steps to establish by 1989 a panel of eminent persons to conduct public hearings in Europe on the activities of transnational corporations in South Africa and Namibia, with a view to further mobilizing public opinion to induce home Governments and transnational corporations to cease any kind of collaboration with the South African régime. Paragraph 10 (a) to (f) contains further requests to the Secretary-General including, inter alia, the preparation of an updated study on the activities of transnational corporations dealing in particular with their disinvestment programmes. No provision was made in the programme budget for these activities and, consequently, an additional appropriation of \$271,600 is requested to cover the requirements listed below:

12. It should be noted that the Council's decision to hold the public hearings in Europe, rather than at the headquarters of the Centre on Transnational Corporations in New York, will necessitate an exception to General Assembly resolution 40/243 of 18 December 1985, paragraph 4. Should the Assembly decide to hold the hearings in New York, the requirements for travel would be reduced by \$47,700, but those for conference-servicing would be increased by \$60,800.

Resolution 1988/62. Resumed session of the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination

Section 1. Overall policy-making, direction and co-ordination (\$98,700)

13. By paragraph 2 of its resolution 1988/62, the Council authorized CPC to resume its twenty-eighth session in New York from 6 to 19 September 1988 in order to consider pending items on its agenda. On the assumption that approximately 70 per cent (i.e. 24) of the Committee's members would avail themselves of the provisions of paragraph 12 of General Assembly resolution 31/93 of 14 December 1976, the Committee was informed that \$131,000 would be required to cover the costs of travel and per diem for 15 days. However, as the first part of the Committee's 1988 session was reduced from the budgeted six weeks to five weeks, thereby saving seven days of per diem, the net additional requirement for per diem at the resumed session is only eight days at \$4,610 per day (i.e. a total of \$36,880). The travel component remains unchanged at \$61,800 and, therefore, an additional appropriation of \$98,700 is requested.

Summary

14. In summary, the requests contained in the four resolutions detailed above would require the following additional appropriations in section 1 (Overall policy-making, direction and co-ordination), section 6B (Centre for Social Development and Humanitarian Affairs), section 9 (Transnational corporations) and section 19 (United Nations Centre for Human Settlements) of the programme budget for the biennium 1988-1989:
