LETTER DATED 29 JUNE 1950 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF BELGIUM TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GELEDAL CONCERNING THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION OF 27 JUNE 1950 (3/1511)

I have the honour to inform you that the resolutions adopted by the Security Council on 25 and 27 June last concerning the aggression upon the Republic of Koroa meet with the full approval of the Belgian Government. The Belgian Government would not have failed to vote in favour of these resolutions had Belgium still been a member of the Security Council. My Government will grant every useful assistance in its power to comply with the recommendation contained in the resolution of 27 June. The Belgium Government's attitude in this respect has, moreover, been defined in a statement made in Farliamont today by the Minister of Foreign Affairs. I shall not fail to communicate the terms of this statement to you as soon as the text is in my possession.

I should be obliged if you would inform the Security Council of the foregoing.
