LETTER DATED 29 JUNE 1950 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF
THE NETHERLANDS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
CONCERNING THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION OF
27 JUNE 1950 (S/1511)

I have the honour to inform you that, in connection with the recommendation contained in the resolution concerning the complaint of aggression upon the Republic of Korea, adopted at the 474th meeting of the Security Council on 27 June 1950, the Netherlands Government, in a statement to the Second Chamber of the Netherlands States General, have, today, declared as follows:

"The Netherlands Government have learned with concern of the breach of the peace which was committed some days ago in the form of an attack on the Republic of Korea by North-Korean troops. They welcome the expedition shown by the Security Council in dealing with this matter, and have noted with satisfaction the resolutions of the Security Council of 25 June and 27 June. The Government have decided to give execution to the resolution which the Security Council has directed to the United Nations, inviting them to furnish such assistance to the Republic of Korea as may be necessary to repel the armed attack of the forces of North-Korea and to contribute to the restoration of international peace and security in the area concerned.

In the interest of furthering an effective implementation of the recommendation of the Security Council, the Netherlands Government are considering the relinquishment of sea forces for participation in the necessary measures to be taken in the above-mentioned area. The Government are at present in close consultation with Indonesia and the Benelux-partners with regard to the situation, and the measures required on the part of the Members of the United Nations."

I should be grateful if you would be instrumental in bringing the above statement to the cognizance of the Security Council.
