LETTER DATED 24 JULY 1950 FROM THE DEPUTY PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF THE UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL IN REPLY
TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL'S CABLEGRAM OF 14 JULY 1950
(S/1619) CONCERNING THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS
OF 25 AND 27 JUNE, AND 7 JULY 1950
(S/1501, S/1511, S/1588)

I have the honour to refer to your telegram No. 17 of 14 July 1950, containing your appeal for assistance in Korea, and to inform you, by direction, that the Government of the Union of South Africa have given the most careful consideration to your message.

Although you will be aware from my note of 30 June of the Union Government's attitude towards the conflict in Korea, I have been instructed to reaffirm that the Union Government, of course, wholeheartedly supports the resolution with regard to the situation in Korea and the steps taken to implement it.

As regards the possibility of providing further assistance to which you refer in your telegram, the Union Government have considered it desirable to discuss certain aspects of your appeal with the Government of the United States. These discussions have already been initiated.
