EXPLANATORY NOTES TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

The Working Group is open to all member States of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE). Other Member States of the United Nations, specialized agencies of the United Nations, other intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) may also participate in a consultative capacity, according to the terms of reference of UNECE (E/ECE/778/Rev.3, paras. 11, 12 and 13). The registration procedure is described in the annex.

In addition to country members in the Working Group, national focal points of the European Environment Agency (EEA) will be invited to participate in the special session.

<u>Item 1: Adoption of the agenda</u>

The Working Group is invited to adopt its agenda.

<u>Item 2:</u> <u>Support to the development of the Kiev Assessment report</u>

(a) <u>Findings of the assessment</u>

The Working Group will consider a draft executive summary of the Kiev report to be prepared by EEA. It may wish to discuss main findings of the pan-European assessment of the environment, in particular those relating to:

- (i) Major environmental trends and threats at the pan-European level and individual subregions;
- (ii) Progress made in the implementation of environmental conventions;
- (iii) Progress made in integrating environmental policies into sectoral and other policies;
- (iv) Development of monitoring and information systems to support environmental decision-making.

The Working Group may wish to decide to transmit its conclusions, as part of the report's executive summary, to the Kiev Ministerial Conference "Environment for Europe" through the Committee on Environmental Policy and the preparatory working group for the Conference.

(b) <u>Individual report chapters</u>

The Working Group will review draft chapters in the following sequence:

- (i) Developments in socio-economic sectors;
- (ii) Prominent environmental problems;
- (iii) Cross-cutting impacts: biodiversity and human health;
- (iv) Managing the environment and sustainable development.

Item 3: Other contributions on environmental monitoring and information to the Kiev Ministerial Conference "Environment for Europe"

(a) Lessons learned from data collection for the Kiev Assessment

The Working Group will discuss a draft paper to be prepared by EEA in cooperation with the secretariat on the results of data collection for the Kiev report, including difficulties met in this exercise, weaknesses in data availability, comparability and reporting at the national and international levels, and possible measures required to improve and streamline the development of national environmental monitoring activities and to facilitate pan-European assessments at the same time.

(b) Guidelines on improving national state-of-the-environment reporting

The Working Group will consider the results of a Workshop on National Environment Reporting to be held in Moscow on 4-5 November 2002. It is expected to agree on draft guidelines for improving national state-of-the-environment reporting as prepared by the Workshop. Inputs by EEA member countries on national state-of-the-environment reporting in Western and Central Europe will also be made available .

(c) <u>Recommendations on strengthening national environmental monitoring and information systems</u>

The Working Group may wish to discuss the type of possible recommendations on strengthening national environmental monitoring and information systems that could be transmitted to Ministers in Kiev for endorsement. These may ensue, inter alia, from:

- (i) Conclusions and recommendations prepared by the Working Group as a result of the evaluation of the situation with environmental monitoring and information in nine countries of Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia;
 - (ii) The inventory of international environmental databases in the UNECE region.

<u>Item 4: Post Kiev reporting at the pan-European level</u>

The Working Group will exchange views on reporting at the pan-European level after the Kiev Conference including future needs for pan-European reviews, the relation with reporting at the global level and possible organizational models.

<u>Item 5: Other business</u>

At the time of writing, the secretariat had no points to propose under this item.
