CABLEGRAM DATED 19 JULY 1950 FROM THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS
OF DENMARK TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL IN REPLY TO THE SECRETARY-
GENERAL'S CABLEGRAM OF 14 JULY 1950 CONCERNING THE SECURITY
COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS OF 25 AND 27 JUNE, AND 7 JULY 1950
(S/1501, S/1511, S/1588)

I HAVE THE HONOUR TO ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF YOUR TELEGRAM OF 14TH JULY. IN
REPLY TO THIS TELEGRAM I BEG TO STATE AS FOLLOWS:

THE DANISH GOVERNMENT FULLY CONSCIOUS OF THEIR OBLIGATIONS AS A MEMBER OF THE
UNITED NATIONS REGRET THAT DENMARK WHO DISPOSES OF VERY LIMITED MILITARY FORCES
ONLY IS NOT IN A POSITION TO RENDER MILITARY ASSISTANCE AS I ALREADY STATED IN MY
TELEGRAM OF 5TH JULY.

HOWEVER, IN ADDITION TO THE OFFER OF MEDICINAL PREPARATIONS MENTIONED IN MY
TELEGRAM, A DANISH RED CROSS AMBULANCE DETACHMENT WITH PERSONNEL CAN BE OFFERED.

FURTHERMORE, THE ROYAL GOVERNMENT WILL PAY ATTENTION TO THE POSSIBILITY OF
RENDERING ASSISTANCE IN OTHER FORMS AND WILL IN CASE BE READY TO DISCUSS SUCH
POSSIBILITIES.
