Addendum

- 1. Pursuant to its resolution 2000/22 of 28 July 2000 and decision 2001/316 of 26 July 2001, the Economic and Social Council established a Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues as a subsidiary organ of the Council, consisting of 16 members, all serving in their personal capacity as independent experts for a term of three years. Eight members are nominated by Governments and elected by the Council according to a specified pattern set out in decision 2001/316, and eight members are appointed by the President of the Council.
- 2. At the 46th plenary meeting, on 20 December 2001, the President of the Council appointed eight experts to the Forum for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2002. At the same meeting, the Council elected seven members to the Forum and postponed to a future session the election of one expert from Asian States for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2002.
- 3. The Secretary-General has received a nomination from the Government of China to fill the outstanding vacancy on the Forum. The candidate is **Qin** Xiaomei. The term of office would begin on the date of election and expire on 31 December 2004.
- 4. Biographical information on Mrs. Qin is set out below.
