I. INTRODUCTION

Under Article 7, paragraph 1, of the Mine-Ban Convention, each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General of the United Nations as soon as practicable, and in any event not later than 180 days after the entry into force of this Convention for that State Party on items (a) to (i). Further, the States Parties shall update these reports annually, covering the last calendar year, and submit them to the Secretary-General of the United Nations not later than 30 April of each year (Article 7, para.2). To facilitate this undertaking and to promote comparability and evaluation of data, in May 1999 the First Meeting of the States Parties adopted the standard reporting format, developed in consultation with States Parties. In September 2000, at the Second Meeting of the States Parties in Geneva, the Article 7 reporting format was amended to include an additional form "Form J: Other relevant matters". This form provides States Parties with the opportunity to report voluntarily on matters pertaining to compliance and implementation not covered by the formal reporting requirements contained in Article 7, in particular to report on activities undertaken with respect to Article 6: on assistance provided for the care and rehabilitation, and social and economic reintegration, of mine victims.¹

To make the reporting procedure more efficient a cover page of the annual Article 7 report has been proposed for consideration by the States Parties at the current 4th Meeting of the States Parties to the Convention. The idea of the cover page is that the reporting party will indicate if something has changed in relation to the previous report. If nothing has changed, the reporting party will limit itself to filling the cover page.²

This report gives an overview of replies transmitted by the States Parties on the standard reporting forms, as of 21 August 2002. The full contents of replies are available on the Internet³.

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Article 7.1
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"Each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General ... on: i) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5."

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".
