LETTER DATED 5 SEPTEMBER 1950 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNION OF  
SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TRANSMITTING  
A CABLEGRAM FROM THREE ASSOCIATIONS OF EX-SERVICEMEN,  
PARTISANS AND DISABLED SOLDIERS OF  
MODENA PROVINCE, ITALY

New York, 5 September 1950

I am sending you herewith a cablegram received by me from the Associations  
of Ex-Servicemen, Partisans and Disabled Soldiers of the province of Modena  
(Italy).

The cablegram reads as follows:

"THE ASSOCIATION OF EX-SERVICEMEN AND FORMER PRISONERS OF WAR, THE  
ASSOCIATION OF ITALIAN PARTISANS AND THE ASSOCIATION OF DISABLED SOLDIERS,  
OF THE PROVINCE OF MODENA (ITALY), PROTEST ON BEHALF OF THEIR 45,650  
MEMBERS AGAINST THE AMERICAN AGGRESSION IN KOREA, INSIST ON THE CESSATION  
OF THE WAR AND THE WITHDRAWAL OF TROOPS, AND DEMAND THAT THE RIGHTS OF  
PEOPLES TO SELF-DETERMINATION BE RESPECTED.

THE PROVINCIAL SECRETARIATS OF THE  
MODENA ASSOCIATIONS OF ITALIAN  
EX-SERVICEMEN"

I would ask you to give instructions for this cablegram to be included in  
the list of letters and telegrams received by the Security Council during August  
1950.
