Qatar repudiates and condemns the seizure of innocent civilians in Moscow

Qatar has repudiated and condemned the seizure of innocent civilians at a theatre in Moscow.

The official spokesman for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has stated the position of the State of Qatar repudiating and condemning the terrorization and confinement of innocent civilians as an act incompatible with all religious precepts and human values.

The spokesman said that the State of Qatar was hopeful that this distressing incident would be brought to a safe conclusion and that the hostages would be released as quickly as possible and without bloodshed.
