UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
TRANSMITTING 1,892 TELEGRAMS AND LETTERS ADDRESSED TO THE
SECURITY COUNCIL

New York, 13 September 1950

I enclose herewith 1,892 telegrams and letters addressed to the Security Council by various organizations and individuals in different countries of the world.

These documents express support of the proposals put forward in the Security Council concerning the peaceful settlement of the Korean question and contain protests against the aggression of the United States Government in Korea, against the barbarous bombing of peaceful cities and inhabited areas by the United States Air Force and against the shooting up of the peaceful population of Korea by the Americans from the air and from the sea.

I would ask you to include these telegrams and letters in the list of letters and telegrams received by the Security Council.

Please issue this letter as a Security Council document.
