LETTER DATED 30 OCTOBER 1950 FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY
COUNCIL ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

I have the honour to refer to my letters of 12 October 1950 and 25 October 1950, and to inform you that the Security Council met again in private session on 30 October 1950, and the following proposal by the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics was voted upon with yeas 1, nays 7, and abstentions 3, and was not agreed upon:

"Proposal of the Soviet Union that the Security Council turn to the General Assembly with the request to postpone consideration of the item on the agenda of the General Assembly relating to the appointment of the Secretary-General of the United Nations."
