~~LETTER~~ DATED 25 NOVEMBER 1950 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF CHINA TO THE  
SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING SECURITY COUNCIL DOCUMENT S/1867

With reference to the Security Council Document S/1867, in which the representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics transmitted a petition addressed by "40,000 Taiwanese-Chinese residents" in Japan to the Secretary-General, I have the honor to send you herewith a copy of denial by Mr. Lin Pingsung, Chairman of the Chinese Resident Association in Japan, which was published in Nagai Times, Tokyo, November 1st, 1950. The text of denial reads as follows:

"According to an Associated Press dispatch from New York, dated October 28th, the representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics transmitted a petition from 40,000 Taiwanese-Chinese residing in Japan to the Secretary-General of the United Nations. I wish to state that we have no knowledge of the alleged petition. This must have been a mistake or a deliberate fabrication. The fact that there are no more than 19,000 Taiwanese-Chinese residing in Japan at present makes it quite obvious that there is no foundation whatsoever in the above-mentioned petition." Please issue my letter as a Security Council document.
