SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF MATTERS
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND THE
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General submits the following statement of matters of which the Security Council is seized and of the stage reached in their consideration on 2 December 1950:

At the 525th meeting on 27 November 1950, the Security Council decided to combine the discussion of the above two items. Consideration then continued at the 526-530th meetings held on 28-30 November.

At the 527th meeting the Representative of the People's Republic of China submitted proposals (S/1921), sponsored by the Representative of the USSR, condemning the United States of America for armed aggression against Taiwan and armed intervention in Korea. The proposals also demanded the complete withdrawal of United States forces from Taiwan and the withdrawal of United States and other forces from Korea.

At the 530th meeting the Council voted on the draft resolutions before it. The result of the voting on the draft resolution submitted by the Representative of the USSR concerning the complaint of armed invasion of Taiwan (S/1757) was one in favour (USSR) 9 against, with one member of Council (India) not participating in the vote. The Council also rejected the draft resolution submitted by the Representative of the Central People's Government of the People's Republic of China and sponsored by the Representative of the USSR by a vote of one in favour (USSR) 9 against, and one member not participating in the vote (India).

The result of the vote on the joint draft resolution concerning the complaint of aggression against the Republic of Korea (S/1894) was 9 in favour, one against (USSR), with one member (India) not participating in the vote. Since a permanent member of the Council voted in the negative, the resolution was not adopted.
