DRAFT RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE PALESTINE QUESTION SUBMITTED
BY THE REPRESENTATIVE OF ISRAEL AT THE 522ND MEETING OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL HELD ON 13 NOVEMBER 1950

(Submitted under rule 38 of the provisional
rules of procedure)

The Security Council,

Having taken note in its resolution of 11 August 1949 of the Armistice Agreement concluded between Israel and Egypt in pursuance of its resolution of 16 November 1948,

Recalling the statements made at the 433rd meeting of the Security Council by the then Acting Mediator for Palestine to the effect that "there should be free movement for legitimate shipping and no vestiges of the wartime blockade should be allowed to remain as they are inconsistent with both the letter and the spirit of the Armistice Agreement",

Desiring to promote the complete implementation of the Armistice Agreements between the Arab States and Israel in the letter and spirit,

Noting that restrictions on the movement of legitimate shipping and measures of blockade are still being maintained at the Suez Canal,

Calls upon the Government of Egypt to remove such restrictions, to abandon blockade practices and to restore the free movement of shipping through the Suez Canal.
