LETTER DATED 9 MARCH 1951 FROM THE PERMANENT REFRESENTATIVE OF NORWAY
TO THE SECRETARY-CENERAL IN REPLY TO THE SECRETARY-CENERAL'S
CABLEGRAM OF 14 JULY 1950 (s/1619) CONCERNING THE SECURITY
COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS OF 25 AND 27 JUNE AND
7 JULY 1950 (s/1501, s/1511, s/1588)

On behalf of my Government I have the honour to offer a field hospital (surgical hospital) as a Norwegian contribution to the United Nations action in Korea.

The hospital, which will have a capacity of 100 beds, will be placed under the authority of the Unified Command. The Norwegian Government will pay all expenses in connection with the procurement of the hospital and its operation for a period of half a year.

According to the calculations made, the field hospital will need approximately 12 doctors and 20 nurses (male and female), who will be recruited in Norway. Additional help, if necessary, will be engaged in Korea.
