NOTE DATED 16 MAY 1951 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNITED STATES ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-CENERAL TRANSMITTING ONE COMMUNIQUE ISSUED BY THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND IN KOREA

The Representative of the United States to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honor to transmit herewith, for the information of the Security Council, the following communique issued by the Headquarters of the United Nations Command, which was delayed in transmission and has not previously been submitted:

United Nations ground forced registered substantial gains along the western Korean front yesterday against light enemy resistance. Strong combat patrols operated forward of advancing units throughout the day. A small enemy counter-attack against advanced elements in the area south of Chorwon was repulsed. East of Hwachon, limited gains were recorded against little opposition.

Naval surface units continued their interdiction of enemy transportation facilities along both coasts as adverse weather conditions hampered air operations.

Land-based aircraft, flying through rain and low clouds, attacked enemy rail facilities while medium bomber formations again heavily bombed the Pyongyang airfield.
