SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11185 of 7 January 1974 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 10 August 1974, the Security Council took action on the following item:

11. Admission of new members (see S/7382, S/7564, S/8301, S/8555, S/8815, S/8896, S/9961, S/10121, S/10296, S/10327, S/10351, S/10462, S/10762, S/10770/Add.1, S/10855/Add.25, S/10855/Add.29, S/11185/Add.22, S/11185/Add.23 and S/11185/Add.24)

In a letter dated 16 July 1974 addressed to the Secretary-General (S/11393), the Chief Commissioner of the Council of State Commissioners of the Republic of Guinea-Bissau submitted the application of his country for admission to membership in the United Nations and declared that Guinea-Bissau accepted the obligations contained in the Charter of the United Nations.

At its 1790th meeting on 8 August, the Security Council included the application of Guinea-Bissau in its agenda. In accordance with rule 59 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council and in the absence of a proposal to the contrary, the President referred the application of Guinea-Bissau to the Committee on the Admission of New Members for examination and report.
