SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11185 of 7 January 1974 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 19 October 1974, the Security Council took action on the following new item:

Relationship between the United Nations and South Africa

At its 1796th meeting on 18 October 1974, the Security Council included the above item in its agenda, listing, as subitems, a letter dated 30 September 1974 (S/11525) from the President of the General Assembly to the President of the Security Council transmitting the text of General Assembly resolution 3207 (XXIX), and a letter dated 9 October 1974 (S/11532) from the Permanent Representative of Tunisia to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council requesting, on behalf of the African Group, that a meeting of the Security Council be convened on the item.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Algeria, Cuba, Dahomey, Egypt, Guinea, Mali, Mauritius, Morocco, Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, Sierra Leone, Somalia, the Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, the United Republic of Tanzania and Zaire, in accordance with their requests, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The Council further agreed to extend an invitation under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure to Mr. David Sibeko, as requested in a letter dated 18 October (S/11539) from the representatives of Kenya and Mauritania.
