SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF  
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE  
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11185 of 7 January 1974 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 26 October 1974, the Security Council took action on the following new item:

Relationship between the United Nations and South Africa

The Security Council continued its consideration of the question at its 1797th to 1803rd meetings held between 21 and 25 October 1974.

In addition to those representatives similarly invited previously, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited at their request, the representatives of the following States to participate in the Council's discussion without the right to vote: Bangladesh, Barbados, Czechoslovakia, the German Democratic Republic, Ghana, Guyana, India, Kuwait, Liberia, the Libyan Arab Republic, Madagascar, Pakistan, the People's Republic of the Congo, Qatar, Romania, South Africa, Uganda, the United Arab Emirates, Upper Volta and Yugoslavia.

The Council also agreed to extend an invitation under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Duma Nokwe, as requested in a letter dated 21 October (S/11540) from the representatives of Kenya and Mauritania.

Also, at the 1802nd meeting, the President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/11543) that had been submitted by Kenya, Mauritania and the United Republic of Cameroon. In its operative paragraph, the three-Power draft resolution (S/11543) read as follows:

"Recommends to the General Assembly the immediate expulsion of South Africa from the United Nations in compliance with Article 6 of the Charter."
