

Subject: First day of issue — 31 January 2003: "Indigenous Art" stamps

### Commemorative stamps

- 1. On Friday, 31 January 2003, the United Nations Postal Administration (UNPA) will introduce a new stamp series on the theme "Indigenous Art", beginning with the art of Latin America and the Caribbean. Each year UNPA will issue three mini-sheets, one each from New York, Geneva and Vienna, each with six different stamps.
- 2. The stamps, in denominations of 37¢, SwF 0,90 and € 0,51, were designed by Rorie Katz and Robert Stein (United Nations).

(United States equivalents: SwF 0,90: 60 cents; and € 0,51: 51 cents, subject to exchange-rate fluctuation.)

#### Selling units

- 3. Owing to the unusual format of the six-stamp sheets, collectors are advised that the following selling units are available:
- (a) Mint stamps full sheets of six stamps only;
- (b) **First-day covers** one large (jumbo) cover for each denomination with the full sheet affixed.

#### General information

- 4. For the convenience of collectors, UNPA at Headquarters will provide prepared and cancelled New York, Geneva and Vienna first-day covers on the UNPA official first-day cachets only. Members of delegations and the staff can obtain these items on Friday, 31 January, at the following locations:
- (a) UNPA sales counter in the concourse of the General Assembly Building: 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.;
- (b) Temporary counter on the east side of the Secretariat lobby between the cafeteria and the news-stand, in front of the windows: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- 5. First day of issue cancellations can be obtained at a temporary United States Postal Service substation located outside the United Nations Bookshop in the concourse of the General Assembly Building from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
