Statement of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine issued on 29 January 2003 on the occasion of the signing of the Treaty between Ukraine and the Russian Federation on the Ukrainian-Russian State Border

28 January marked a prominent event in the history of Ukraine and the Russian Federation: Presidents Leonid Kuchma and Vladimir Putin signed the Treaty on the Ukrainian-Russian State Border. This completed an important stage of legal formalization of the Ukrainian State Border.

The signing of the Treaty opens a new page in the centuries-old history of the Ukrainian and Russian nations. It expands opportunities for further development of the relations between Ukraine and Russia as independent sovereign States and good neighbours. Our peoples confirmed their aspiration to build their mutual relations on the principles of friendship, cooperation and partnership. Hereby they made another contribution to the cause of strengthening European security.

The Treaty will contribute to the consolidation of a high level of mutual understanding and trust, to the civilized resolution of the issues which may arise between Ukraine and the Russian Federation.

The work done represents a road map for further cooperation in the settlement of remaining problems and a guarantee of their resolution in the interests of both sides. To this end Ukraine will continue to make efforts to complete legal formalization of the State Border along its full perimeter.
