The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4668th and 4681st meetings, held on 16 and 20 December 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the 4668th meeting, held on 16 December 2002, in accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Terje Roed-Larsen, Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process and Personal Representative of the Secretary-General.

At the 4681st meeting, held on 20 December 2002, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Israel, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 20 December 2002 from the Permanent Observer of Palestine to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2002/1395), the President, in accordance with the rules of procedure and the previous practice in that regard, invited the Permanent Observer of Palestine to participate in the discussion.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2002/1385) that had been submitted by the Syrian Arab Republic.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2002/1385, which received 12 votes in favour (China, Colombia, France, Guinea, Ireland, Mauritius, Mexico, Norway, Russian Federation, Singapore, Syrian Arab Republic and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland), one against (the United States of America), and two abstentions (Bulgaria and Cameroon). the draft resolution was not adopted owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council.
