LETTER DATED 2 JULY 1973 FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE
ON THE SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION
ON THE GRANTING OF INDEPENDENCE TO COLONIAL COUNTRIES AND PEOPLES
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to transmit herewith for the attention of the Security Council the text of a consensus concerning the question of Namibia (A/AC.109/425) adopted by the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples at its 926th meeting, on 29 June 1973.*

Paragraph 6 of the consensus read as follows:

"6. In the light of the continued defiance of United Nations decisions by South Africa as well as its intensified repression of the Namibian people, and bearing in mind the direct responsibility of the United Nations for the Territory and its people, the Special Committee expresses the hope that the Security Council will take effective measures, in accordance with the Charter, to secure South Africa's compliance with its resolution 310 (1972) calling for its immediate withdrawal from the Territory."
