REPLIES RECEIVED FROM GOVERNMENTS

DENMARK

The attitude of the Government of Denmark towards the trial was stated in the Permanent Representative's note of 29 January 1968.<sup>1/</sup> It will be recalled that on 25 January the Government of Denmark through appropriate channels urgently called upon the Government of South Africa to discontinue proceedings in court against the South West Africans concerned and to release and repatriate them.

Following the passing of sentences in the trial the Permanent Representative of Denmark in the meeting of the Security Council on 16 February 1968 reiterated the strong protest of his Government against the continued persecution of the South West Africans concerned and pledged the full co-operation in the matter of the Delegation of Denmark to the Security Council with a view to obtain agreement on solutions which can bring about the release and repatriation of the South West Africans concerned.

SINGAPORE

The Government of the Republic of Singapore has no diplomatic relations with the Government of South Africa and is not in a position to influence directly decisions in South Africa.

The Government of the Republic of Singapore has consistently supported the General Assembly's resolutions in regard to the apartheid policies of the Government of South Africa as well as on the question of South West Africa. It sponsored General Assembly resolution 2324 (XXII) and was also one of the Member States which requested the convening of the Security Council to consider the question of the trial of thirty-five South West Africans by the Government of South Africa.

It is hoped that such international action in the United Nations will influence the Government of South Africa to comply with the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly.
