LETTER DATED 13 MAY 1983 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF INDIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The Seventh Conference of Heads of State or Government of Non-Aligned Countries, held at New Delhi from 7 to 12 March 1983, "called upon the United Nations Security Council to meet, as soon as possible, in order to consider further action on the implementation of its plan for Namibia's independence, thereby assuming its primary responsibility for implementation of Security Council resolution 435 (1978)". The Co-ordinating Bureau of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries, meeting in New York, decided that a meeting of the Security Council should be requested for 23 May 1983. Accordingly, on behalf of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries, I have the honour to request you to convene the Security Council in order to enable it to further consider the question of Namibia.
