FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY

The Government of the Federal Republic of Germany is following the trial against the South West Africans convicted in Pretoria for legal and humanitarian reasons with great concern. Therefore, and in accordance with resolution 2324 (XXII) of the General Assembly and resolution 245 (1968) of the Security Council, the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany in Pretoria has been instructed to send an observer to the trial. The Ambassador of the Federal Republic of Germany in Pretoria moreover has been instructed to make representations to the Government of South Africa in the spirit of these resolutions.

With reference to General Assembly resolution 2324 (XXII), the Government of Thailand has the honour to state that it has no diplomatic relation with South Africa; therefore, it is not in the position to influence directly any actions of that Government concerning the trial of the thirty-seven South West Africans. However, the Government of Thailand holds the view that the policy adopted by South Africa in this matter is not consistent with the provisions of the United Nations Charter, nor with the relevant resolutions on the question.
