SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/10855 of 2 January 1973. During the week ending 14 April 1973, the Security Council took action on the following item:

In a letter dated 12 April 1973 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/10913), the representative of Lebanon, referring to his letter of 11 April 1973 to the President of the Council (S/10911) in which he had brought to the attention of the Security Council details regarding the act of aggression committed by Israel against Lebanon on 10 April 1973, requested an urgent meeting of the Security Council to deal with the question.

The Security Council met to consider the question at its 1705th meeting on 12 April 1973 and included the item in its agenda. The Council continued its discussion at its 1706th meeting held on 13 April. At the 1705th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Lebanon, Israel, Egypt and Saudi Arabia, pursuant to their requests, to participate in the discussion, without the right to vote. Similar invitations to participate in the discussion were extended at their requests at the 1706th meeting to the representatives of Algeria and the Syrian Arab Republic.
