SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/10855 of 2 January 1973. During the week ending 23 June 1973, the Security Council took action on the following item:

11. Admission of new Members (see S/7382, S/7564, S/8301, S/8555, S/8815, S/8896, S/9961, S/10121, S/10296, S/10327, S/10351, S/10462, S/10762 and S/10770/Add.1)

In a letter dated 12 June 1973 addressed to the Secretary-General (S/10945), the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the German Democratic Republic transmitted the application of his country for admission to membership in the United Nations, together with a declaration, signed by the Chairman of the Council of Ministers, accepting the obligations contained in the Charter of the United Nations.

In a letter dated 13 June 1973, addressed to the Secretary-General (S/10949), the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Federal Republic of Germany submitted the application of his country for admission to membership in the United Nations, together with a declaration, signed by the Federal President and the Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs, accepting the obligations of the United Nations Charter.

At its 1729th meeting on 21 June 1973 the Security Council included the two applications for membership in its agenda, and the President, pursuant to rule 59 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, referred to the Committee on the Admission of New Members for its consideration and report, the application of the German Democratic Republic and the application of the Federal Republic of Germany.

The Committee submitted its report on 21 June (S/10957) in which it recommended that the Security Council adopt the following draft resolution:

"The Security Council,

"Having considered separately the application of the German Democratic Republic (S/10945) and the application of the Federal Republic of Germany (S/10949) for admission to membership in the United Nations,

"1. Recommends to the General Assembly that the German Democratic Republic be admitted to membership in the United Nations;

"2. Recommends to the General Assembly that the Federal Republic of Germany be admitted to membership in the United Nations."

At its 1730th meeting on 22 June 1973 the Security Council considered the report of the Committee on the Admission of New Members and adopted, without objection, the draft resolution recommended by the Committee as resolution 335 (1973).
