QUESTION OF SOUTH WEST AFRICA

Solution to the question of South West Africa

Philippines: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Noting with the gravest concern that despite its various resolutions and the advisory opinions of the International Court of Justice on the matter, the question of the Mandated Territory of South West Africa is no nearer to solution today than when it first arose,

Considering it in the best interests of all parties concerned that a satisfactory solution to the question should be reached as soon as possible,

Requests the Secretary-General:

(a) To study the question of South West Africa with the end in view of finding ways and means for a satisfactory solution of the problem in line with the Assembly resolutions and the advisory opinions of the International Court of Justice;

(b) To consult or negotiate with the Government of the Union of South Africa on how such a satisfactory solution could be brought about; and

(c) To report to the General Assembly for its consideration at its twelfth session the results of his studies and his consultations or negotiations with the Government of the Union of South Africa, together with such comments, observations and recommendations as he may consider appropriate for the satisfactory solution of the question of the Mandated Territory of South West Africa.
