PREPARATIONS FOR THE ELEVENTH SESSION OF THE CONFERENCE (UNCTAD XI)

Proposal by the Secretary-General of UNCTAD for the substantive item of the provisional agenda for UNCTAD XI

Enhancing coherence between national development strategies and global economic processes

Achieving the agreed development goals for the Millennium will require greater coherence between, on the one hand, international processes and negotiations, notably in the fields of trade, investment and technology, and on the other hand diverse national development strategies. The role of UNCTAD should be to help ensure that coherence. In particular:

- UNCTAD XI should help generate international consensus on how to make global mechanisms, disciplines and processes more development-friendly, including both in ongoing negotiations and in proposals for reform.
- UNCTAD XI should advance understanding on development strategies that seize
 opportunities offered by international trade and investment while taking account of the
 constraints posed by globalization, based on the experiences of developing countries at
 different stages of development.
