REPORT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING THE CREDENTIALS OF
THE REPRESENTATIVES AND DEPUTY AND ALTERNATE REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE MEMBERS OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL ELECTED FOR THE PERIOD
1975-1976

1. At its 2266th plenary meeting, on 11 October 1974, the General Assembly elected Guyana, Italy, Japan, Sweden and the United Republic of Tanzania non-permanent members of the Security Council for a term of two years, beginning 1 January 1975.
2. Pursuant to rule 15 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General wishes to report that, with regard to the representation of the members of the Security Council elected for the period 1975-1976, he has received the communications referred to hereunder.
3. Guyana. In a letter dated 28 November 1974 addressed to the Secretary-General, the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Guyana stated that Mr. Rashleigh E. Jackson had been appointed representative of Guyana on the Security Council, Mr. Miles Stoby deputy representative, and Mr. Joseph A. Sanders and Mr. Noel G. Sinclair alternate representatives.
4. Italy. In a letter dated 6 December 1974 addressed to the Secretary-General, the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Italy stated that Mr. Eugenio Plaja had been appointed representative of Italy on the Security Council.
5. Japan. The Secretary-General has received credentials signed by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Japan on 26 November 1974 certifying that Mr. Shizuo Saito had been appointed representative of Japan on the Security Council, Mr. Masao Kanazawa deputy representative, and Mr. Tadashi Ohtaka alternate representative.
6. Sweden. In a letter dated 25 November 1974 addressed to the Secretary-General, the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Sweden stated that Mr. Olof Rydbeck had been appointed representative of Sweden on the Security Council, Mr. Kai Sundberg deputy representative, and Mr. Rolf Ekéus and Mr. Jan Ståhl alternate representatives.
7. United Republic of Tanzania. In a letter dated 6 November 1974 addressed to the Secretary-General, the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the United Republic of Tanzania stated that Mr. Salim A. Salim had been appointed representative of the United Republic of Tanzania on the Security Council, and Mr. Sebastian Chale and Mr. Paul Rupia alternate representatives.
8. In the opinion of the Secretary-General, all of the above credentials are in order.
