Declaration of the Twelve on the situation in the Sudan

The Twelve express their grave concern about the situation in the Sudan and call upon all parties to allow relief supplies - especially food - to be speedily delivered to the needy, to support the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in its plan of action and to open the road to peace. This is the only way to relieve suffering and to enable the Sudan to recover socially and economically from its present crisis.
