Agenda item 17 (d)APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN SUBSIDIARY ORGANS AND
OTHER APPOINTMENTS: CONFIRMATION OF THE APPOINTMENT OF
MEMBERS OF THE INVESTMENTS COMMITTEENote by the Secretary-General

1. As indicated in document A/43/104 of 17 February 1988, it will be necessary for the General Assembly, during its current session, to confirm the appointment by the Secretary-General of three persons to fill vacancies in the Investments Committee resulting from the expiration, on 31 December 1988, of the terms of office of Mr. Aloysio de Andrade Faria (Brazil), Mr. Braj Kumar Nehru (India) and Mr. Stanisław Raczkowski (Poland).
2. Furthermore, in document A/43/104/Add.1 of 26 April 1988, the Secretary-General informed the General Assembly that Mr. David Montagu (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) had resigned from the Investments Committee and that, accordingly, the Assembly would be required to appoint a person to fill the unexpired portion of his term of office, that is until 31 December 1989. The Secretary-General proposes that Mr. Juergen Reimnitz (Federal Republic of Germany), who has served as an ad hoc member of the Committee since 1975, be so appointed.
3. In accordance with the provisions of article 20 of the Regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund, the Secretary-General, after consultation with the Standing Committee, on behalf of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, submits for confirmation by the General Assembly the re-appointment of Messrs. Faria, Nehru and Raczkowski as members of the Investments Committee for three-year terms of office and Mr. Reimnitz for a one-year term of office, beginning on 1 January 1989.
4. Mr. Faria was first appointed to the Investments Committee in 1976, Mr. Nehru has served on the Committee since 1962 and as its Chairman since 1977,

Mr. Raczkowski has served on the Committee since 1977 and Mr. Reimnitz has assisted the Committee as a co-opted member since 1975. The Secretary-General very much appreciates their willingness to continue to carry on this important international public service.

5. The curricula vitae of the appointees and the nominee being submitted for confirmation follow.

6. In accordance with past practice, the Secretary-General also proposes to co-opt as an ad hoc member Mr. Ahmed Abdullatif (Saudi Arabia) to serve with the Committee in 1989.
