

Summary

The present report is mandated by General Assembly resolution 57/133 and contains a list of specialized agencies and international institutions associated with the United Nations, to whom the provisions of this resolution apply, and whose attention was brought to it by the Secretary-General.

- 1. At its fifty-seventh session, the General Assembly adopted resolution 57/133 of 11 December 2002 concerning the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations. In paragraph 16 of that resolution, the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to continue to assist the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system in working out appropriate measures for implementing the relevant resolutions of the United Nations and to prepare for submission to the relevant bodies, with the assistance of those agencies and organizations, a report on the action taken in implementation of the relevant resolutions, including resolution 57/133, since the circulation of his previous report.
- 2. In a letter dated 12 February 2003, the Secretary-General brought the text of the resolution to the attention of the executive heads of the following specialized agencies and other international organizations and invited them to submit the information requested for inclusion in the report referred to in the above paragraph:
