## BRIEF BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Igor Vasilevich Khalevinsky was born in 1944. He graduated from the Moscow State Institute of International Affairs in 1967. He entered the diplomatic service in the same year, specializing in international affairs and economic problems of developing countries.

From 1967 to 1969 and from 1974 to 1979 he worked as Secretary at the USSR Embassy in Pakistan. From 1969 to 1974 and from 1979 to 1980, he worked in the South Asia Section of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the USSR, dealing with the financial policy and economy of the countries of the region. From 1980 until the present time he has been a counsellor in the office of the Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs of the USSR on budgetary, administrative and personnel matters of international organizations.

As a member of Soviet delegations, he has participated on a number of occasions in the work of various international meetings and conferences, including the United Nations General Assembly.

He holds the degree of Candidate of Economic Sciences.

He is married and has a son.
