INFORMATION CIRCULAR No. 26

Subject: World Health Assembly - WHO
International Labour Conference - ILO

- 1. The fifty-sixth session of the World Health Assembly and the ninety-first session of the International Labour Conference will be held at the Palais des Nations from 19 to 28 May and 3 to 19 June 2003, respectively.
- 2. High-ranking officials and many delegates will be attending these events at the United Nations Office at Geneva. Vehicular and pedestrian access to and movement within the Palais grounds are likely to be difficult. During each of these sessions, some parts of the Palais might also be temporarily declared "high security areas".
- 3. Some car parks will be reserved for the above conferences, as follows:

From 19 to 28 May: All of P-3 and P-5 (lower) From 3 to 19 June: All of P-3 and P-5 (lower)

Exceptionally, staff members may park in the Cour d'honneur (Armillary Sphere). Cars must be parked diagonally to the kerb.

4. The arrangements for access to the Palais will not change:

The Pregny gate will be open 24 hours a day.

The railway gate will be open between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on working days only.

The Place des Nations gate will be open to pedestrians between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. and, at other times, with the magnetic card.

5. It would be appreciated if everyone would cooperate by complying with the traffic signs and the instructions of the Security and Safety Section. Cars which are parked in such a way as to obstruct traffic or cause a risk of accidents are liable to be removed by outside companies at the owners* expense.
