## Letter 5 August 1983 from Colonel Muammar Qaddafi of the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya addressed to the President of the Security Council

I wish to inform you that international security is faced by a threat of the utmost gravity in the Arab region and the Horn of Africa as a result of the landing of United States forces of all kinds in Egyptian, Sudanese, Somali and Omani territories. I would have no right to speak on behalf of those countries, were it not for the fact that two of them are situated on my country's borders. The landing of these forces presents a direct threat to the security of my country, and my country is ready to defend itself wherever it is threatened as a result of the landing from sea and air of the American forces on its borders.

I wish to inform you that the responsibility for any breakdown of international security in this region as a result of that lies entirely with the Government of the United States of America and, consequently, with the United Nations Security Council, if it does not intervene to compel that Government to halt this large-scale troop landing, which threatens security in this extremely sensitive and troubled region.

I request that the Security Council take all measures consistent with its responsibility for safeguarding the security of States Members of the United Nations and also peace and security in the region.
