Letter dated 5 October 1983 from the Permanent Representative of Pakistan
to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 21 September 1983 (A/38/443-S/16001), I have the honour to bring to your attention yet another serious violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side which took place on 22 September 1983. Details of the incident are as follows:

On 22 September 1983, Afghan artillery fired 10 shells from their Gurgarai Post (opposite Pakistan Frontier Corps Lakka Tigga Post) between 1345 hours to 1445 hours (Pakistan Standard Time) which landed in our territory, approximately four kilometres south-east of Lakka Tigga Post and about 16 kilometres south-west of Sadda in Kurram Agency. As a result, seven refugees (a man and six women) were injured.

I request Your Excellency to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 29, and of the Security Council.
