Logarska dolina (The Valley of Logarska, Slovenia) 9 -14 September 2003

Second Announcement and Information concerning the Workshop

This document is an information note for participants. It contains the explanatory notes, the provisional agenda and practical information for the workshop. Attached is a registration form which participants are requested to return not later than **15 June 2003.** Please forward this information note to any specialists who may be interested in the workshop topic.

OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE OF THE WORKSHOP

The workshop will offer the opportunity to exchange experiences and share information on the state of the art of knowledge for the improvement of forest operations in farm forests considering in particular cost efficiency of operations, environmental impacts, the social dimension in terms of employment and income as well as contribution to rural development. The role and importance in the overall forestry, rural and regional development should be analysed and challenges such as market competitiveness of products in a growing global economy and continuing process of urbanisation be recognised.

It will, furthermore, discuss issues on sustainable forest operations and improved utilisation, using existing low-cost farm equipment as well as new approaches in the field of farmers' co-operation with industrial forestry, wood processing industry, wood-based energy sector as well as with the contractor's sector. Attention will be paid in particular to the reduction of the environmental impacts and wastes, assessment of the importance of forest operations in supporting agriculture based farming activities, the farmers partnership in the field of forest operations, the role of wood processing and its marketing, interference farm-forest operations with the urban society, the role of self-employment, and the evaluation of decision support systems for alternative machine combinations, aiming to increase the economics of operations and reducing the overall costs with the special emphasis on conditions in countries in transition to market economy and their future role (e.g. EU enlargement).

The workshop will also deal with workers' safety and health standards in farm forest operations, accident prevention, vocational and on the job training, forest operation investment strategy, use of contract workers, business contracts, work organization and control as well as post harvest assessments.

It is expected that the workshop will offer a contemporary overview of role, prospects and trends of forest operations related to the farm forests and its importance within the forestry sector, changes needed and guidelines for their contribution to the overall forest conservation and utilisation.

PLACE AND DATES OF THE WORKSHOP

The workshop will be held from **9 - 14 September 2003 in Slovenia at the Hotel Plesnik** (http://www.plesnik.si) in Logarska dolina (The Valley of Logarska), which is located approximately 20 km south from the Austrian border and 80 km east from the Italian border.

ORGANIZATION

The seminar is being organised under the auspices of the Joint FAO/ECE/ILO Committee on Forest Technology, Management and Training with the participation of the International Union of Forestry Research Organizations, and in co-operation with the Slovenian Government.

The workshop Steering Committee is represented by Mr. Joachim Lorbach, Forest Harvesting Trade and Marketing Branch, FAO, Rome. The Organising Committee is represented by M. Sc. Robert Robek, Slovenian Forestry Institute, Ljubljana, Slovenia.

PARTICIPANTS

The workshop is aimed at all those involved in forestry, in particular in developing, planning and executing forest operations and management, as well as in teaching, training and extension work and in administrative and policy advisory services:

- Forest operations managers;
- Representatives of private and public forest enterprises;
- Officials of forest services and administrations;
- Scientists, teachers and trainers from universities, forestry schools, vocational training and extension centres;
- Representatives of non-governmental organisations, forestry associations and forest contractors;
- Representatives of decision-making bodies.

Papers and posters will be presented under the following headings:

- Item 6 **Importance of farm forests for forestry, rural and regional development:** role of farm forestry in societies of urbanisation and in view of globalisation, employment and income generation, provision of additional raw material including special wood products (e.g. poles, chips, fuelwood) for forest industries and society.
- Item 7 **Education, extension and training for farm forest owners:** Transfer of technical knowledge and skills, improving safety and health in forestry work, reduction of accidents rates, increase of competence, work performance and outputs.
- Item 8 **Organization and financial support for farm forest owners and associations:** formation of associations to develop infrastructures supporting forestry and agricultural activities, assistance in contract operation arrangements, business negotiations and contracts, technical and financial assistance through non-governmental and governmental forestry organisations.

STUDY VISITS

One full day and one half day study excursions will be offered:

Thursday, 11 September 2003

In this half-day excursion we will visit two modern farms in Austria and Slovenia. They traditionally depend on forest resources and we will examine the recent responses on contemporary challenges on forest resources in these regions. We will also view demonstrations of their machinery and existing forest operations as employed in farm forests, wood utilisation and marketing practices. A presentation will be made on responses to market challenges and sustainable forest management in mountainous forests as well as economical and ecological considerations of their forest operations and wood utilisation.

Friday, 12 September 2003

In this full-day excursion, we will demonstrate diversity of the private forests in Slovenia. There will be a discussion on the impact of social and economic differences on forest operations and wood utilisation and measures that may be taken to increase the contribution to sustainable development in the local society and region. In addition, selected cultural sites along the excursion route will be visited and explained.

The following audio-visual aids will be available: Computer for Power Point presentations, video system (VHS), slide projector and overhead projector.


Participants wishing to show videos or films are requested to give the necessary information on their registration form (title, length of projection time and format, etc).

Registration

Participants are requested to send their completed <u>registration form</u> (Annex) not later than 15th June 2003 to the addresses indicated on the form. Registered participants will receive further information about the workshop. Preliminary registered participants <u>do not need to register again</u> but must provide arrival and accommodation details as well as their contributions. In the case of interest a spouse program will be organised.

Participants with presentations and/or posters are asked to submit the abstracts of their work to organisers by the same date -15^{th} June 2003.

Organisational costs for the workshop, welcome and farewell event, coffee or tea between presentations, travel costs for the study visits as well as fees for entrances during cultural visits are \cup 40 per participant and \cup 0 per accompanying person. This sum should be paid in cash (either Euro or Slovenian Tolar) when registering at the registration desk in the Hotel Plesnik upon arrival, in advance for the workshop. Accompanying persons are invited to the excursions and to the welcome and farewell events. Spouse program is not included in accompanying person fee but it can be organised upon request at the hotel reception.

Participants should pay the costs for board and lodging directly to the hotel. Reservations for the accommodation will be made through preliminary registration form and accepted on 'first come first served' basis. Bed & breakfast basis is not possible, since there are no restaurants or shops in the vicinity of the workshop venue.

Passports and visas

All participants should have a valid passport and, if required, an entry visa, which can be obtained from the Slovenian Embassy or Consulate in their own country. In addition participants should take care of their visa for the excursion to Austria on 12th September. Visa applications should be made as early as possible.

Weather

Daytime temperature at the workshop venue in September normally varies between 18 to 25°C and during the night 12 to 17°C. During the study visits suitable shoes for forest visits will be needed.

Money exchange

Money can be exchanged at the money exchange offices at the railway stations or at the airport. Major credit cards are accepted for board and lodging at the hotel. If necessary the major currencies can be exchanged also at the Hotel Plesnik.
