LETTER DATED 31 OCTOBER 1988 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Upon instructions from my Government and pursuant to my letter No. 731 dated 28 October 1988, I have the honour to inform you of further violations of the cease-fire by Iraqi forces. The numerical sequence of these violations follows the sequence in the said letter.

- 345. On 24 October 1988, between 1120 and 1250 hours, Iraqi forces stationed at the Maleki Shiller barracks broadcast anti-Iranian propaganda in the Persian language.
- 346. On 26 October 1988, at 1033 hours, an Iraqi reconnaissance helicopter violated Iranian airspace, entering it from the geographic co-ordinates of 91-88 on the map of Birkim and subsequent to cruising at a low altitude for approximately 5 minutes over the Kelashin operational theatre re-entered Iraqi western territory.
- 347. On 26 October 1988, at 1040 hours, a number of Iraqi personnel at the geographic co-ordinates of 35-15 on the map of Hosseinieh and 871-381 on the map of Ein-Khosh were seen constructing barricades.
- 348. On 26 October 1988, at 1150 hours, Iraqi forces stationed a Dushka weapon system at Nahr-e-Anbar.
- 349. On 26 October 1988, Iraqi forces at the geographic co-ordinates of 96-29 on the map of Sardasht constructed a barricade.
- 350. On 26 October 1988, Iraqi forces constructed barricades at the geographic co-ordinates of 818-492, 816-504 and 80-52 on the map of Garmab.
- 351. On 26 October 1988, Iraqi forces were seen constructing barricades between the geographic co-ordinates of 643-871 and 64 973 on the map of Baneh.

352. On 27 October 1983, at 2220 hours, from the heights around Shiller, Iraqi forces fired at Iranian forces with light weapons. This barrage halted, only to be resumed at 2330 hours, at which time four artillery shells were fired at Iranian forces at the defensive line.

It would be highly appreciated if this letter were circulated as a document of the Security Council.
