Report of the Secretary-General on the situation along the cease-fire line in Kashmir

Addendum

- 1. The Chief Military Observer of the United Nations Military Observer Group in India and Pakistan (UNMOGIP), Lt. General Luis Tassara González, reported on 18 December 1971 at 1100 hours WPT that the low level of activity along the cease-fire line and the border (A/8556/Add.10-S/10432/Add.10, para.1) had continued until 1930 hours on 17 December, at which time the cease-fire announced by the two Governments came into effect. Air activity was almost negligible.
- 2. At 1700 hours on 17 December, all field stations reported a quiet day, with only sporadic artillery exchanges. Field Station Jammu reported an overflight of the town at 1000 hours by Pakistan Air Force planes which did not attack but were engaged by anti-aircraft fire. Most field stations were informed by the local military authorities that the cease-fire would be effective at 1930 hours.
- 3. At 1100 hours on 18 December, all field stations reported that there had been no activity during the night. The military observer team which had been withdrawn from Field Station Punch to Rajouri on 13 December (A/8556/Add.7-S/10432/Add.7) left for Punch at 1845 hours on 17 December to reopen the Field Station.
