LETTER DATED 22 JULY 1970 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVES
OF BURUNDI, FINLAND, NEPAL, SIERRA LEONE AND ZAMBIA ADDRESSED
TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

In resolution 276 (1970) adopted by the Security Council at its 1529th meeting on 30 January 1970, on the Question of Namibia, the Council decided i.a. to establish in accordance with rule 28 of the provisional rules of procedure an Ad Hoc Sub-Committee of the Council to study, in consultation with the Secretary-General, ways and means by which the relevant resolutions of the Council, including resolution 276 (1970), could be effectively implemented in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the Charter, in the light of the flagrant refusal of South Africa to withdraw from Namibia, and to submit its recommendations to the Council.

In operative paragraph 9 of the resolution, the Council further decided "to resume consideration of the question of Namibia as soon as the recommendations of the Sub-Committee have been made available".

Since the Ad Hoc Sub-Committee, established in pursuance of Security Council resolution 276 (1970), has now submitted its report to the Council (S/9863) the undersigned, representatives of Burundi, Finland, Nepal, Sierra Leone and Zambia, co-sponsors of Security Council resolution 276 (1970), have the honour, on instructions from their respective Governments, to request an early meeting of the Security Council to resume consideration of the Question of Namibia.
