1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignation of Henry Fox (Australia) from the Committee on Contributions effective 16 October 2003. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required to appoint, at its current session, a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining period of the term of office of Mr. Fox, which expires on 31 December 2004.
2. The Government of Australia has nominated David Dutton to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Mr. Fox.
3. In a communication dated 22 October 2003, the Secretariat was informed by the Chairman of the Western European and Other States Group that the candidature of Mr. Dutton has been endorsed by that Group.
