LETTER DATED 27 AUGUST 1969 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF PAKISTAN ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

- 1. The High Commission for Pakistan in India presents its compliments to the Ministry of External Affairs and with reference to their note No. PV 104/28/69 dated 25 June 1969 has the honour to state that the State of Jammu and Kashmir is not, and has never been, recognized as a part of Indian territory and, therefore, the Government of India have no <u>locus standi</u> to lodge any protest with the Government of Pakistan in respect of the matter referred to in their note.
- 2. The Government of Pakistan also takes exception to the threat implied in paragraph 5 of the Ministry of External Affairs' note which ill accords with the professions of the Government of India to improve relations with Pakistan.
- 3. In view of the position stated above, the Government of Pakistan rejects the Government of India's note.

The High Commission for Pakistan avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of External Affairs the assurances of its highest consideration.
