LETTER DATED 24 JULY 1969 ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL BY THE REPRESENTATIVES OF CHILE, COLOMBIA, GUYANA, INDIA, INDONESIA, NIGERIA, PAKISTAN, THE UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC, TURKEY, YUGOSLAVIA AND ZAMBIA

We the undersigned, representatives of eleven countries, have the honour to draw your attention to resolution 264 (1969), which the Security Council adopted unanimously on 20 March 1969 and by which it called upon the Government of South Africa immediately to withdraw its administration from the Territory of Namibia and decided that in the event of failure on the part of the Government of South Africa to comply with the provisions of the resolution, the Security Council would meet immediately to determine upon necessary steps or measures in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter of the United Nations.

On behalf of our respective Governments and in view of the preoccupations we share as members of the United Nations Council for Namibia, we request you urgently to convene the Security Council in order that it may consider the situation resulting from the wholly negative reaction of South Africa to the above-mentioned resolution and from the measures which it is continuing to take in defiance of the authority of the Security Council and General Assembly.
