The National Assembly of the Republic of Hungary adopted Act CXXXIII of 1997 on November 24 ratifying Amended Protocol II and Additional Protocol IV of the Convention on the Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Extensively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects ("CCW"). The Act was published in the Bulletin of the Home Defense Forces on 22 April 1998.

Information to the civilian population

The Act was also published in the official Bulletin of the Republic of Hungary on March 7, 1998. Several Articles were published at the time of the adoption of the Act, furthermore when the destruction of Hungary's remaining stockpiles of anti-personnel mines was completed on June 29, 1999.

Mine clearance programs

Since the end of the 1950s there have been no identified of suspected minefields on the territory of the Republic of Hungary, accordingly no mine clearance programs have been necessitated since that date. On June 29, 1999, the Republic of Hungary announced the complete elimination of her stockpiled anti-personnel mines, well ahead of her self-imposed deadline as stipulated in the Annex to the Act CXXXIII of 1997 with the provisional target date of December 31, 2001.

Rehabilitation programs

For the lack of victims with specifically mine-related injuries, the initiation of such programs has not been necessitated.
