### **Documentation**

The Secretariat will:

(a) Make a presentation on the general trends of United Nations activities in the area of public administration for the review and guidance of the Committee;

(b) Provide the Committee for its consideration a note by the Secretary-General on the preparation of a strategic framework for the period 2006-2007. In this connection, attention is drawn to General Assembly resolution 58/269, in which the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit to it at its fifty-ninth session a strategic framework for the biennium 2006-2007, comprising part one: a plan outline, reflecting the longer-term objectives of the Organization, and part two: a biennial programme plan, to cover two years, to replace the current medium-term plan for the period 2002-2005.

7. Proposed programme of work and agenda for the next session of the Committee of Experts.

The Committee will review its programme of work and make recommendations to the Economic and Social Council on the agenda for its fourth session.
